2. Students planning to attend graduate school should take MA 151.
3. Twelve additional hours in psychology are required, which may include SW 236 and 345. Many electives in the major will be alternating year courses. PY 230 does not count towards major requirements.
4. SO 111 is strongly recommended.
5. BI 111/L is a prerequisite for PY 375.
6. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
7. Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
