NOTES:

1. Four semesters of Greek recommended, but only GR 111 is required. Students may substitute 6 hours of another language and a cultural enrichment course for GR 121 and GR 211.
2. Must take four hours of elective courses from the Bible and Religion major.
3. Six hours from 300 or 400 level complementary courses outside the Bible and Religion department or additional courses within the department (additional courses could include BR 331, 333, 440, and 460).
4. BR 311 does not count toward major requirements.
5. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
6. Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
