3. Students must take three of the following OA215 Business Software Application courses or equivalent certificate: Word Processing, Spreadsheet, Database, and Computer Graphics.
4. PY 111 is recommended for those who anticipate having a minor in marketing or entrepreneurial small business.
5. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
